The study also examines demographic factors like age and educational attainment to understand the broader context of astrological engagement. The conversation offers a thorough examination of astrology's place in modern life by utilizing viewpoints from historical books, online resources, and astrological literature. The findings imply that although astrology offers many people a relevant framework, its impact varies greatly, depending on personal views and the sources of astrological knowledge consulted. This study advances awareness of astrology's continuing influence on social and human dynamics and its persistence in modern spiritual practices.

I. Introduction

In the twentieth century, astrology saw a rebirth while adjusting to contemporary circumstances, despite the Enlightenment and the growth of scientific skepticism. The

popularity of horoscopes and astrological therapy, which have permeated many aspects of modern life such as media, psychology, and personal identity reveals this rebirth (Kelly, 2015). Astrology gained more traction in the late 20th century New Age movement, which placed a strong emphasis on astrological insights for individual spirituality and self-discovery (Heelas, 2008).

Modern astrology continues to thrive, supported by technological advancements that provide easy access to astrological resources and communities. Online platforms and applications offer personalized astrological readings and foster global connections among enthusiasts (Miller, 2019). This digital transformation has democratized access to astrological knowledge and facilitated integration into daily life, making astrology more accessible and relevant.

The continued use of astrology in modern spiritual activities begs the question of its cultural and psychological relevance. According to research, astrology can provide a sense of purpose and control in an increasingly complicated and uncertain environment (Hamilton, 2001). Furthermore, astrology's symbolic language resonates with the human need for narrative and coherence and provides a framework for introspection and personal development (McRae, 1995).

1.1 Statement of the Problem

The validity and scientific reliability of astrological forecasts are still up for question, despite technological breakthroughs and the explosion of astrological applications and websites. Williams (2021) points out that although astrology is now more widely available because of digital platforms, doubts regarding the veracity of astrological claims remain. This gap between popular opinion and scientific analysis influences how astrology is viewed and applied in contemporary settings.

Technology's infusion into astrology has revolutionized conventional methods, but it also raises questions about the reliability and profundity of astrological experiences. While digital platforms increase user involvement, Parker (2022) points out that they can also result in a shallow comprehension of astrological principles. App-based engagements may replace traditional, in-person consultations, which could influence the level and caliber of astrological advice given.

The influence of astrology differs greatly depending on the culture and demographic context. Comprehending these disparities is vital in evaluating the functioning of astrology in diverse socioeconomic settings and its significance in individual and societal identities. The monetization of astrology has moral concerns with the exploitation of people looking for assistance, especially digital applications and online services. According to Mitchell (2021), the commercialization of astrology may put financial gain ahead of the well-being of its clients, raising questions about the moral standards of astrological service providers and the possibility of deception or manipulation.

Both opportunities and challenges arise from traditional ideas with modern astrological procedures. Knapp (2020) looks at how psychology and frameworks for human growth are included in modern astrology, but that integration can also weaken conventional astrological knowledge. To comprehend these traditions' evolution and continued relevance, it is crucial to investigate how they align with astrological systems from historical and cultural contexts.

1.2 Objectives of the Study

The primary objectives of this study are:

- a. To explore the historical development of astrology and its integration into various religious and spiritual practices.
- b. To examine the resurgence of astrology in the 20th century and its adaptation to modern contexts.
- c. To analyze the psychological and cultural factors contributing to the persistence of astrological beliefs in contemporary spiritual practices.
- d. To investigate the role of technology in democratizing access to astrological knowledge and fostering global astrological communities.

1.3 Significance of the Study

II. Research Methods

2.1 Materials

c. Survey and Interview Instruments

Collect qualitative and quantitative data from individuals in contemporary astrological practices, standardized questionnaires, and semi-structured interview guides were created. These tools were used to investigate the astrological beliefs, experiences, and motives of the participants.

2.2 Methods

The research utilizes a mixed-methods approach, integrating qualitative and quantitative techniques to offer a thorough examination of the continued relevance of astrological ideas in modern spiritual activities.

a. Literature Review

Compile material about astrology from the past and now, a thorough review was done. Academic books, articles, and online materials that address the cultural relevance, historical evolution, and contemporary applications of astrology are included in this review (Barton, 1994; Campion, 2012; Kelly, 2015).

b. Administration of the Survey

An online, structured questionnaire was sent to a broad sample of people who consider themselves practitioners or lovers of astrology. Demographic data, the frequency of astrological practice, sources of astrological information, and the perceived advantages of astrology were all covered in the survey. The trends patterns, the responses were gathered via an online survey platform and then examined using statistical software.

c. Interviews

A purposive sample of participants chosen from the survey respondents participated in semi-structured interviews. The purpose of these interviews was to get more in-depth details about their individual experiences and the cultural and psychological importance of astrology. To find recurring themes and narratives, interview data were transcribed and subjected to thematic analysis (Braun & Clarke, 2006).

d. Content Analysis

To comprehend how contemporary technology affects and supports astrological practices, a content analysis of contemporary astrological resources was carried out. These resources included online horoscopes, astrological blogs, and digital applications. This investigation concentrated on the kinds of information that are accessible, how they are presented, and how involved users are (Miller, 2019).

e. Data Analysis

To find important trends and associations, descriptive and inferential statistics were used to examine quantitative survey data. To find reoccurring themes and insights, data from qualitative interviews and content analysis were coded and subjected to thematic analysis. The amalgamation of quantitative and qualitative results yielded a thorough comprehension of the research inquiries.

Using these techniques, the study hopes to present a comprehensive picture of how celestial influence continues to exist in contemporary astrological activities, providing insights into the historical foundations and current relevance of astrology.

III. Results and Discussions

3.1 Results from Surveying

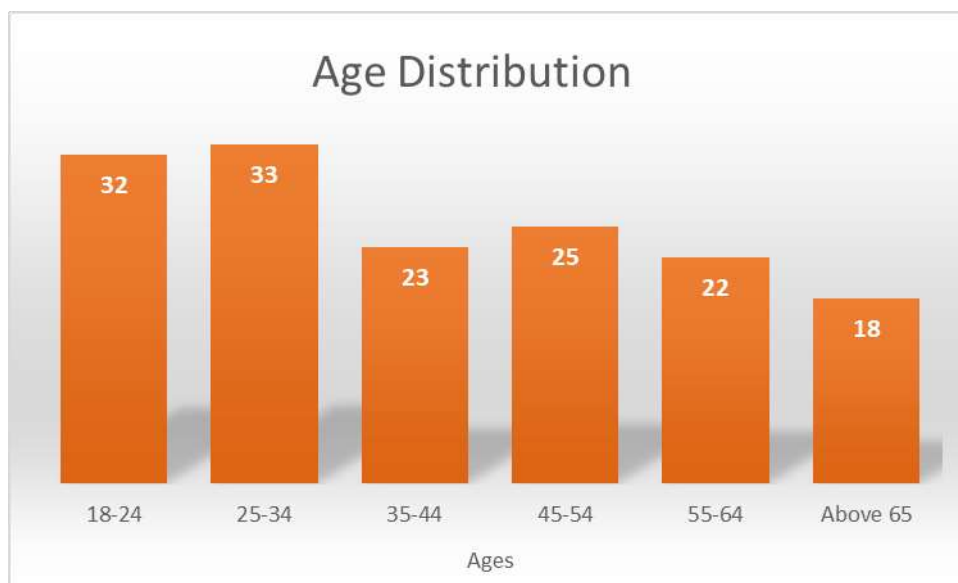


Figure 1. Age distribution of the respondents

Figure 1 shows the respondents' age distribution demonstrating the range of age groups in the study. Of the overall sample, respondents who were between the ages of 18 and 24 made up 22.4%; 32 people fell into this category. Among the responders, this age group makes up one of the largest divisions, suggesting that younger adults are very engaged. Thirty-three respondents, or 23.1% of the sample, belonged to the largest group of respondents: those aged 25 to 34. This group accounts for almost half of all respondents, together with the 18–24 age group, indicating that young to early middle-aged persons were very involved in the survey process.

Twenty-three respondents, or 16.1% of the sample, were between 35 and 44. The younger age groups suggest that middle-aged adults participate at a lower rate. Similarly, 25 people, or 17.5% of the sample, were in the 45–54 age group. The participation rate in this group is similar to that of the 35–44 age group, indicating a steady level of involvement among persons in their late middle years.

There were 22 responders in the 55–64 age range, or 15.4% of the sample. This implies that, even while a sizable percentage of respondents in this age range continued to participate in the survey, participation declines more with age.

Lastly, with 18 respondents, the oldest group—those 65 and older—represented 12.6% of the sample. This shows the lowest level of engagement across the age groups surveyed. There are several possible reasons for this, including accessibility, interest, or the demographics of the population under study.

The age group of 18 to 34 accounts for the bulk of responders, indicating higher levels of engagement among younger people. Comprehending these distributions is essential for evaluating the study's findings since different age groups could have unique viewpoints and experiences that affect the study's conclusions.

There are more male participants than female participants, according to the respondents' gender distribution. Of the total respondents, 65 were female and made up about 44.1% of the sample; 80 male respondents made up around 55.9% of the sample. This gender gap implies that men participated in the survey process higher than women. Comprehending the gender distribution holds significance as it could impact the study's overall conclusions and interpretations. The viewpoints, experiences, and survey replies of different genders may differ, which could add to the diversity and depth of the information gathered. Examining the causes of the gender gap in participation may help with effective engagement tactics for upcoming surveys.

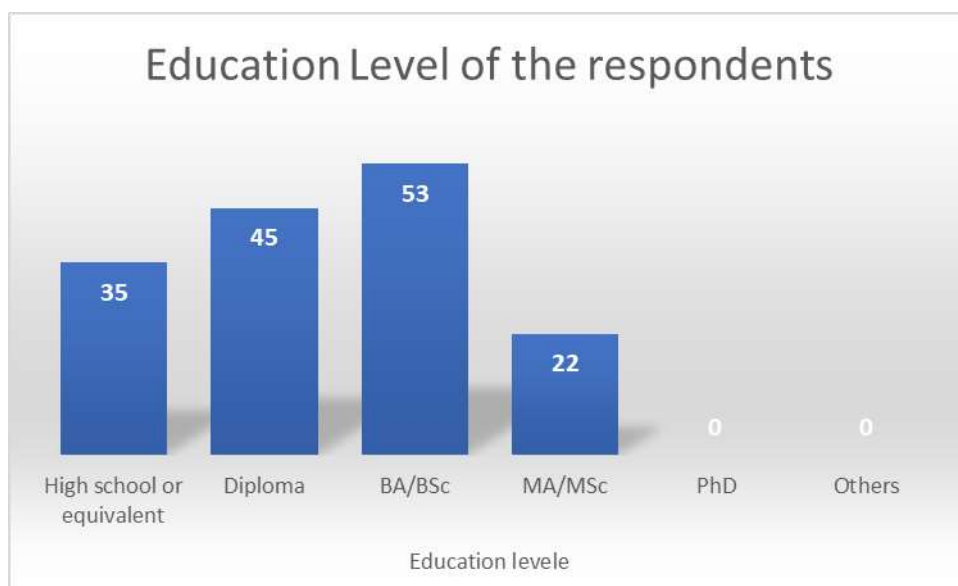


Figure 2. *The education level of the respondents*

The respondents' educational backgrounds, as depicted in Figure 2, demonstrate different academic backgrounds among the participants. 53 respondents, or the largest group, had a BA or BSc degree the most prevalent level of education in the sample. This implies that a sizable percentage of the participants have completed higher education, which could influence their viewpoints and survey responses.

Notably, 45 respondents the second-largest group have earned a diploma. This shows that individuals have technical or vocational training, underscoring the range of educational backgrounds outside the standard academic degrees.

Thirty-five respondents who have completed high school or its equivalent are included in the poll. This category comprises those who either followed non-academic career choices or went straight into the workforce in secondary school. Their inclusion offers a more comprehensive picture of the educational landscape of the people.

Remarkably, 22 responders hold a master's degree (MA/MSc) a lesser but noteworthy percentage of highly educated individuals in the sample. Nonetheless, the absence of respondents possessing a PhD indicates a possible deficiency in those with the greatest academic accomplishment or a restricted curiosity about the survey subject within this cohort.

3.2 Engagement in Astrological Practices

The survey's findings show that while respondents' levels of astrological practice varied, many of them engaged in it regularly. In particular, seventy-five respondents, or most of the sample, said they did astrological activities daily. This daily involvement implies that astrology has a steady and significant impact on these people's lives. Consistent engagement with astrological content, such as perusing horoscopes or utilizing astrological applications, could provide direction, ease, and consistency, supporting their everyday decision-making and introspective thinking (Campion, 2016).

29 respondents said they engaged in astrological practices every week. These people continue to use astrology regularly, even though it's not as much as daily users, which shows a continuing interest in the profession. Weekly engagement could indicate a more intentional approach, when people review astrological counsel in the upcoming week, possibly utilizing it to schedule or coordinate their activities with observed cosmic influences (Parker, 2020).

Seven respondents, making up a smaller sample, use astrology every month. This implies that these people may use astrology for particular occasions, such as new moon ceremonies or monthly horoscopes, which correspond with particular astrological cycles. Rather than using astrology as a daily guide, monthly users can see it as a tool for periodic reflection or goal formulation (Thompson, 2019).

The 12 respondents' report of occasional interaction suggests that these people only occasionally engage with astrology. This group may use astrology as a supplemental tool rather than a regular part of their lives, turning to it during important life events or uncertain times. The fact that some people utilize astrology occasionally implies that they might not rely entirely on it but benefit from its insights when necessary (Berman, 2018).

Ultimately, twenty-two respondents said they had never used astrology. This group comprises people who do not consider astrology important to their lives or who do not believe in it. A lack of participation may be a general indifference to the metaphysical parts of astrology or a preference for more empirical or scientific methods of making life decisions (Tyson, 2001).

3.3 Impacts on Real Life

Different astrological practices at different degrees have distinct effects on people's lives. Daily users may find that astrology has a significant impact on their relationships, daily decisions, and self-perception. Astrology can offer a framework for comprehending one's possibilities and problems, which can help one feel more in control of life or more in line with imagined destiny. On the other hand, an over-reliance on astrology may also result in an over-reliance on outside guidance, which is not the same as using one's initiative (Campion, 2016).

For those who utilize astrology on a weekly or monthly basis, it can be a helpful tool that improves their life planning and introspection. These people might combine their astrological knowledge with other self-improvement techniques to make well-rounded decisions. Confirmation bias, on the other hand, is a possibility, in which people use astrological predictions to support preexisting ideas or wants (Parker, 2020).

The occasional user probably uses astrology and other types of assistance, using it when necessary for more clarity or comfort in particular circumstances. For them, astrology is a supplementary tool that helps them make decisions without taking over. It gives them peace of mind when things are unclear. The contemplative and symbolic elements of astrology may be helpful to this group without the hazards involved with more frequent interaction (Thompson, 2019).

People who never use astrology probably run their lives according to other frameworks, including logic from science, faith, or instinct. The lack of astrology in their lives indicates that they rely on more practical or empirical methods to deal with life's obstacles. This group may favor approaches that are more in line with their worldview and consider astrology to be invalid or irrelevant (Tyson, 2001).

3.4 Sources of Astrological Information

The survey's findings show the range of sources that participants used to obtain astrological knowledge and how different people interact with astrology in the digital era. Online horoscopes are the most often used source; 57 respondents said they use them. This choice highlights how easily accessible and convenient online platforms provide daily, weekly, and monthly horoscopes with only a click. Online horoscopes are widely accessible and satisfy the need for immediate, customized astrological insights, which is by the fast-paced lifestyle of today (Parker, 2022).

With 48 respondents stating they used astrology apps, they were the second most popular source. Based on users' birth charts, apps like Co-Star and The Pattern—offer personalized astrological readings and updates. The increasing tendency of fusing technology with individual spirituality is exemplified by the popularity of astrological apps. These applications frequently have social media elements, daily alerts, and interactive features that draw users in and improve the individualized astrological experience (Williams, 2021).

35 respondents said they use social media platforms another important source of astrological knowledge. The popularity of astrological content on social media sites like Instagram, Twitter, and TikTok has increased due to a growing number of astrologers and aficionados posting daily videos, memes, and insights. Social media's communal feature enables users to exchange their insights and experiences, creating community and connection among astrological practitioners. Astrological information on social media gains awareness and influence due to its viral nature, particularly with younger viewers (Thompson, 2019).

With only five replies, books are the least used source, yet they are still important for individuals who want to learn astrology more deeply. Astrological beliefs, history, and practices are explained in great depth in traditional literature. Books provide an organized and thorough examination of astrology that may not be found in digital sources for dedicated students. People's desire for rapid and interactive information sources in the digital age may be reflected in the declining consumption of books (Berman, 2018).

3.5 Impacts on Real Life

The source that an individual chooses to learn about astrology can influence astrology in their daily lives. Online horoscopes and astrology applications are accessible and provide personalized content that affects users' daily decisions and routines. By providing regular updates and notifications, people can develop the habit of regularly seeking astrological guidance, making it a seamless part of their everyday lives (Parker, 2022).

Through peer interactions and shared content, social media, because of its communal and participatory aspect, can increase the influence of astrology. Participating in astrological discussions and posts can help people develop a shared set of beliefs where they support and validate one another's views and experiences. Because of this social component, astrology can play a big role in social identity and cultural expression, especially for younger generations who use social media often (Thompson, 2019).

Although they are not as widely used, books provide a depth of information that can result in a more complex and nuanced understanding of astrology. Those who get their astrological information from books could take a more academic approach to the discipline, including it in a larger framework of philosophical and metaphysical understandings (Berman, 2018).

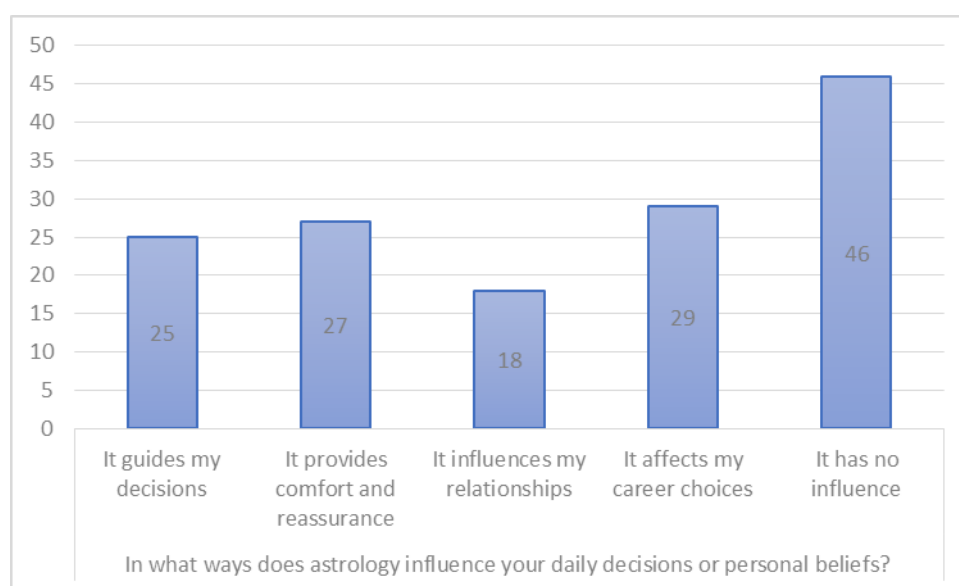


Figure 3. Influences of astrology in respondents' decisions.

3.6 Influences of Astrology in Daily Decisions and Personal Beliefs

The survey's findings show the various ways that respondents' personal views and daily decisions are influenced by astrology. While 46 respondents, or a sizable fraction of the sample, stated that astrology had no bearing on their lives, a sizable portion claimed that astrology had different effects on their worldview and decision-making.

Astrology has a significant influence on 29 respondents' employment decisions. This impact implies that these people might employ astrological knowledge to direct their career paths, such as advantageous planetary alignments or zodiac features. Astrology's influence on professional choices may result from the perception that following astrological guidance can maximize one's natural talents and chances for achievement. For example, people may take advantage of or forego particular professional possibilities based on astrological predictions or guidance specific to their sign (Parker, 2022).

Only a small percentage of respondents (27) said that astrology gives them peace of mind and confidence. This research emphasizes the emotional and psychological support that astrology can provide, particularly in ambiguous or difficult circumstances. Astronomers and horoscope readers could take solace in the regularity and orderliness of celestial motions. People may feel more at ease and confident to tackle life's obstacles if they believe they are in tune with cosmic forces (Campion, 2016). Because it gives people a sense of control over their circumstances and helps them deal with stress and worry, astrology has a comforting reputation.

25 respondents also cited astrology as a source of guidance, demonstrating its direct influence on decisions made in daily life. These people may use astrological insights to help them brand decisions about anything from mundane chores to life events. This decision-making process may involve consulting daily horoscopes or birth charts to determine the optimal times to take action. A regulated lifestyle where choices are made by imagined cosmic influences can result from astrology beliefs (Thompson, 2019).

Astrology has an impact on relationships for 18 of the respondents. This could entail evaluating the likelihood of romantic or interpersonal relationships succeeding through relationship horoscopes or astrological compatibility charts. People who think astrology influences relationships might look for partners whose signs match their own or utilize astrological guidance to resolve disputes and improve communication. Astrology's influence on relationships emphasizes how it can influence how people interact with each other and how they feel about themselves based on readings of the stars (Berman, 2018).

It is interesting to note that the respondents 46 said astrology did not influence their beliefs or decisions. This group prefers to base their conclusions on other criteria, including logic, experience, or scientific reasoning, and probably considers astrology unimportant or untrustworthy. This group's existence points to a critical astrological viewpoint that prioritizes empirical data and human agency over astrological counsel (Tyson, 2001).

3.7 Interview and Group discussion results

What quantity attracted people to join astrology?

There are various significant reasons why astrology is so appealing to people. These elements speak to the social and psychological aspects of the human experience and explain why astrology is still a widely accepted and long-lasting practice.

Astrology is a popular choice for psychological support and direction. Astrology provides insights into a person's character and life path, as well as answers for personal struggles. Farris (2020) asserts that astrological readings' organized and methodical style gives people control and clarity, particularly in difficult times.

Astrology aids people in discovering and comprehending who they are. People can learn more about their personalities, as well as their strengths and shortcomings, by examining astrological charts and signs. In his discussion of astrology's function in identity formation and personal growth, Campion (2012) points out that this process of self-discovery may be uplifting and affirming.

Shared astrological beliefs and practices among devotees promote social relationships and a sense of community. People can exchange their information and experiences on websites, social media groups, and astrological associations, which nurtures a lively and encouraging community (Miller, 2019).

Astrology has a rich cultural and historical past that appeals to those who value old wisdom and customs. Astrology has a rich historical foundation due to its roots in ancient societies such as Mesopotamia, Egypt, Greece, and Rome. According to Barton (1994), this

historical context enhances the appeal of astrology as a way to connect with the past and a timeless source of wisdom.

Modern astrology frequently has useful applications, like job assistance, personal development, and relationships. The *Astrology of You and Me* by Berman (2018) is one book that demonstrates how astrological insights may be applied to daily life, making astrology relevant and helpful in making practical decisions.

Numerous people utilize astrology as a method for spiritual development and discovery. It provides a framework for comprehending the cosmos and one's role in it. According to Campion (2012), astrology appeals to people looking for a deeper spiritual connection and the purpose of a cosmological perspective.

How do people integrate astrology into their lives?

Individuals use astrology in their lives in different ways, frequently to better understand themselves, make wise decisions, and derive meaning from their experiences. The subsequent delineation delineates the essential techniques by which astrology is integrated into everyday customs and rituals:

An individual can gain a deeper understanding of their underlying tendencies and potential by examining their natal charts, which depict the placements of celestial bodies at the moment of birth. Berman (2018), for instance, talks about how knowing one's astrological sign can help one become more self-aware and direct one's personal growth.

Many people consult astrological forecasts while choosing options for their careers, relationships, or important life events. Horoscopes, which offer daily, weekly, or monthly forecasts based on zodiac signs, are a common tool. Astrological forecasts, which provide a sense of timing and cosmic alignment, according to Parker (2022), can influence decisions about anything from major life transitions to everyday activities. Astrology is frequently used to determine a partner's compatibility in love, family, and work relationships. Synastry charts, which contrast the natal charts of two persons, aid in understanding the dynamics and possible difficulties of interpersonal relationships. Berman (2018) thoroughly illustrates how astrological compatibility tests might improve relationships by emphasizing harmonious and potentially conflicting areas.

Astrology can assist people in synchronizing their inner lives with cosmic rhythms by being included in spiritual and meditation practices. This integration could include timing ritualistic or meditative rituals according to astrological cycles, such as lunar phases. According to Campion (2012), astrology can enhance spiritual practices by providing a cosmology viewpoint that links individual experiences with the larger cosmos.

Astrology is frequently used by creative professional writers, artists, and musicians, for example, to understand their creative cycles and to inspire their work. Astrological insights help them identify their strengths and schedule periods for high and low production. According to Parker (2022), knowing one's astrological chart can help with professional progress and contentment by offering insightful information about one's work skills and timing.

Astrological charts also called natal or birth charts show the exact locations and times of a person's birth by charting the positions of celestial bodies. These diagrams provide a starting point for comprehending personal characteristics, inclinations, and possible avenues for development. Individuals use these charts' insights in a variety of ways to further their development:

The rising sign, moon sign, and sun sign are said to be essential elements of a person's personality. The sign denotes one's outward appearance, the moon sign reveals emotional nature, and the sun sign symbolizes inner self. According to Berman (2018), people can develop a stronger sense of self-awareness is essential for personal development, by comprehending these fundamental concepts.

Based on planetary aspects and positions, astrological charts show different strengths and shortcomings. For example, Mars's position may point to areas where you need to be more forceful and driven, while Saturn's position may point to obstacles and areas where you need to practice discipline. According to Knapp (2020), acknowledging these characteristics enables people to build on their shortcomings and capitalize on their strengths, promoting a well-rounded approach to personal growth.

The movement of celestial planets throughout time is tracked by transits and progressions, which are used to interpret and manage life transitions. These astrological methods can shed light on times of transition, development, and difficulty. According to Thompson (2019), by helping people prepare for and cope with significant life events, awareness of these cycles helps foster resilience and personal growth.

A natal chart's moon sign and moon angles can provide light on emotional reactions and demands. People can enhance their emotional intelligence and cultivate stronger relationships and overall well-being by gaining a deeper grasp of their emotional environment. According to Campion (2012), developing emotional awareness is essential to personal development since it helps one navigate one's emotional environment more empathetically and clearly.

Astrology offers a framework for comprehending one's place in the universe, making it a useful tool for spiritual discovery. For example, Neptune's position can point to areas of spiritual sensitivity and intuition, while Pluto's placement can draw attention to life-changing events. According to Parker (2022), incorporating these astrological insights into spiritual practices helps strengthen one's sense of direction and connectedness to the universe, promoting all-encompassing human development.

People can enhance their interactions with others by being aware of how astrology affects both their own and other people's conduct. Astrology charts, which contrast the signs of two individuals, are frequently used to assess compatibility and relationship dynamics. Berman (2018) offers helpful guidance on how this comprehension might result in more contented and harmonious relationships, which are crucial for personal development.

3.8 Analysis of Historical Texts and Literature on Astrology

a. Ancient Mesopotamian Astrology

Astronomical observations were carefully documented in ancient Mesopotamia, which is where the practice of astrology first emerged. Mesopotamian astrology stretches back to the second millennium BCE and was intimately associated with both political and religious life, according to Barton (1994). Using planetary motions and star locations, the Babylonians created an intricate system of celestial omens that helped them forecast events and make decisions. Their conception of divine influence and rule was based on these customs (Campion, 2012).

b. Egyptian Astrological Practices

Astrology was essential in ancient Egypt for coordinating religious and architectural designs with heavenly bodies. Campion (2012) emphasizes how the Egyptians' precise astronomical orientation of temples and pyramids reflected their belief in the divine significance of the stars. One example of astronomical observation and religious symbolism

is the alignment of the Great Pyramid of Giza with the constellation Orion (Barton, 1994). It was believed that these alignments would make it easier to communicate with the divine and guarantee the pharaoh's favor in the hereafter.

c. Greek and Roman Astrology

Greek and Roman contributions had a significant influence on the evolution of astrology. Scholars such as Ptolemy systematized Greek astrology which was influenced by Babylonian traditions. His seminal work *Tetrabiblos* established the principles of horoscopic astrology and functioned as a template for subsequent Western astrological methods (Barton, 1994). The Greeks integrated astrological ideas into their philosophical and mythical systems because they believed that celestial bodies were divine entities that had an impression on human events.

Roman astrology had a significant emphasis on applying astrology to personal and political affairs and continued this practice. According to Barton's (1994) documentation, astrology was widely used by the Roman nobility to consult on matters of both private and public concern. This underscores the pervasiveness of astrology in the system of social decision-making.

d. Medieval and Renaissance Astrology

Astrology continued to be influential during the Middle Ages thanks to the translation and analysis of classical literature. A resurgence of astrological interest occurred during the Renaissance, spurred by scholarly inquiry and the increasing public acceptance of astrological forecasts (Campion, 2012). During this time, astrological practices were incorporated with new scientific theories as researchers such as Johannes Kepler attempted to balance astrological theories with observational astronomy (Kelly, 2015).

e. Ethiopian Astrological Practices

Astrology has a long history in Ethiopia, entwined with the religion and cultural customs of the nation. According to historical records, Ethiopian astrology was influenced by an assortment of cultural connections with ancient Egypt and the wider Mediterranean region (Bianchi, 2009). Ethiopian astrological customs are ingrained in the cosmology of the area, where the heavens are important to religious and cultural activities.

Integrating Ethiopian astrology with the calendar and liturgical traditions of the Ethiopian Orthodox Church is one of its main features. The observation of lunar cycles and their effects on religious celebrations and agricultural activity is a common practice in traditional Ethiopian astrological systems. For example, astrological factors impact religious observances and seasonal activities; this is reflected in the Ethiopian calendar, which is based on a blend of moon and solar cycles (Pankhurst, 2001).

In addition, Ethiopian astrology has a distinctive system of celestial symbols and star signs that are applied to divination and traditional medicine. These customs, which combine cultural beliefs with ancient astrological knowledge, are thought to offer insights into people's health and futures (Kassam, 1995).

Ethiopia in the present day is a place where global astrology and technology breakthroughs coexist with traditional astrological rituals. Ethiopian traditional astrological methods continue to exist, showing the cultural significance and flexibility of astrology. Ethiopian astrologers of today frequently combine traditional wisdom with modern techniques, demonstrating the dynamic interaction between past customs and present-day patterns (Kassam, 1995).

f. Analysis of Contemporary Astrological Books, Journals, Websites, and Digital Applications

Astrology is still developing in the modern world, with major contributions from websites, digital apps, recently published books, and scholarly publications. Knapp's analysis shows how astrology can be viewed through the prism of current psychological practice and theory by fusing conventional astrological principles with modern psychological theories.

A regular feature of the *Journal of Contemporary Spirituality* is an inspection of the relationship between astrology, spirituality, and identity. For instance, a Thompson (2019) essay explores how astrology can be used in the digital age to facilitate self-empowerment and self-discovery. j. Integration of Technology and Astrology

The way astrological information is accessible and used has changed significantly due to the integration of technology with astrology. Astrology may now reach a worldwide audience because of the expansion of its reach through digital platforms and applications. Real-time updates, community features, and interactive horoscopes are just a few of the new forms of engagement made possible by this technology transformation (Williams, 2021).

Another sign of how technology is changing the field of astrology is the rise of online forums and organizations where enthusiasts discuss and share insights and experiences. Websites like Reddit and specialized astrology forums, which provide spaces for community

support, direction, and discussion, help to better integrate astrology into contemporary social and cultural contexts (Parker, 2022).

3.9 Integration of Astrology with Personal Growth: Perspectives from Astronomy and Religion

a. Astronomy perspective

Astronomically speaking, people tend to be skeptical of astrology's connection to personal development. As a science, astronomy is concerned with the scientific investigation of celestial bodies and their physical characteristics, motions, and interactions with one another and the universe. These are some salient points:

Astronomy uses rigorous scientific evidence and methodologies to study the universe. However, astrologers frequently employ correlations and symbolic interpretations without any supporting data. Tyson (2001) asserts that there is no evidence linking the positions and motions of celestial bodies to changes in human behavior or personality.

Astronomy recognizes the historical and cultural significance of astrology. A lot of the ancient astronomers also practiced astrology, including Ptolemy. However, astrology and astronomy separated as science advanced. Astrology is not regarded as a scientific field by the scientific community, but rather as a historical artifact (Barton, 1994); (Campion, 2012). Celestial Mechanics: Astronomy focuses on celestial mechanics, or the physical rules regulating the motions of planets, stars, and other bodies, while astrology examines the symbolic interpretations of celestial placements. The scientific community stresses that these mechanics have no bearing on an individual's personality or psychological characteristics (Tyson, 2001).

b. Religion's Perspective

Numerous and varied religious interpretations of astrology exist, contingent upon the spiritual tradition and cultural context. The following observations are drawn from diverse religious viewpoints:

Astrology and Christianity have always had a complicated relationship. Astrology was frequently combined with religious rites during the Middle Ages. Nonetheless, with the advent of contemporary Christianity, astrology has come to be associated with superstition and divination, which are often frowned upon (Campion, 2012). Deuteronomy 18:10–12 and other biblical texts that prohibit divination and seeking knowledge from celestial bodies are the cause why many Christian groups disapprove of astrology.

In contrast, Jyotish astrology is heavily incorporated into Hinduism's religious and cultural practices. Hindu astrology determines auspicious times for rituals, marriages, and other significant life events. Many Hindus incorporate it into daily and spiritual life (Frawley, 2000). Hindu astrology is a revered and essential component of Hindu religious practice since it is closely linked to Hindu cosmology and sacred writings.

Islam has differing opinions about astrology. The Quran forbids utilizing the stars for divination, even as it promotes their study for navigation and comprehending God's creation (Quran 6:97, 15:16). Since astrology might result in shirking the grave sin of associating partners with Allah many Islamic scholars reject it (Nasr, 2006). Nonetheless, medieval Islamic researchers investigated astrology in a more comprehensive scientific and cultural framework, as demonstrated by Al-Biruni, who shed light on a complex historical relationship.

Modern new age movements and contemporary spirituality usually accept astrology for psychological and spiritual growth. According to these viewpoints, astrology can help people comprehend their place in the universe and establish a connection with the cosmos (Campion,

2012). In this setting, astrology is frequently combined with other spiritual disciplines that emphasize holistic well-being, self-discovery, and personal empowerment.

IV. Conclusion

The respondents' frequency of astrological practice varies greatly, with everyday users making up the largest group. The practical applications of astrology depend on the degree of involvement; individuals who utilize astrology more frequently may find that it has a greater impact on their outlook and daily choices. On the other hand, people who participate in decision-making processes infrequently or never may depend on alternative sources of direction and frameworks. Understanding these patterns of involvement can aid in comprehending the various effects on individuals and how function in contemporary society.

Astronomically speaking, astrology is distrusted because it lacks scientific rigor and empirical support. Astrology studies the properties and movements of celestial bodies; claims made by astrology about these bodies' influence on human fate and behavior are not supported by science. The emergence of digital platforms has increased accessibility to and integration of astrology into daily life. People can now easily and dynamically interact with astrological knowledge because of the democratization of access to astrological knowledge brought about by applications and internet resources. This, however, also prompts questions over the possibility of commercialization and a shallow comprehension.

Theological perspectives on astrology are very diverse. Because of worries about divination and superstition, certain religious traditions like Hinduism integrate astrology into their spiritual practices, others like Christianity and Islam often view it cautiously or reject it completely. However, astrology is now accepted by the New Age and contemporary spiritual movements as a tool for spiritual development and personal empowerment.

Recommendations

Based on the exploration of astrology from various perspectives, here are the recommendations for individuals, practitioners, researchers, and educators:

Ensure that their advice is supportive, non-exploitative, and considerate of their clients' psychological well-being, practitioners should abide by ethical norms. Refrain from creating fear- or determinism-based forecasts.

Encourage multidisciplinary studies on historical, cultural, and psychological aspects of astrology. These kinds of studies can provide insight into the detail of astrology is relevant today and how it affects people personally and socially. Conduct empirical research to examine the psychological impact of astrology on individuals. This research can help distinguish between placebo effects and any true benefits, if any, from astrological activities. To provide students with a thorough grasp of astrology's role and relevance in many communities and eras, incorporate discussions of the subject into larger cultural and historical studies.

Have candid discussions regarding astrology's place in religious contexts. Recognize the range of opinions within religious traditions and encourage civil debate on various historical, theological, and cultural viewpoints.

Astrology-integrating traditions guide its appropriate application in spiritual practices, stressing the symbolic and reflective qualities of astrology above its predictive components.

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
